HistoricPlacesLA Launches

In parallel to the GCI and World Monuments Fund's development of <u>Arches</u>—an open source, web- and geospatially-based information system to inventory and manage immovable cultural heritage—the GCI, working with the City of Los Angeles, has customized the system to create <u>HistoricPlacesLA</u>.

Launched in February 2015, HistoricPlacesLA is the first online information and management system specifically created to help inventory, map, describe, and protect the city's significant cultural resources. HistoricPlacesLA includes information gathered to date through SurveyLA, as well as information on thousands of designated historic resources throughout the city. Over time, it will include information on all designated resources, as well as on all resources identified through SurveyLA.








VIDEOS
