The Urban Fellows Programme (UFP) at the Indian Institute for Human Settlements (IIHS) will run from August 2018 to May 2019. The UFP is a tuition free, nine-month, interdisciplinary fellowship designed for learners from a wide range of disciplinary background and interested in urban issues.

India's urban transition is characterised by numerous urban challenges, which require an interdisciplinary approach to urban practice. The Fellowship's curriculum draws from the IIHS curriculum co-created in partnership with the world's leading universities including the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), University College London (UCL), the University of Cape Town (UCT) and the Federal University of the ABC Region, Sao Paulo (UFABC), in addition to nearly a hundred practitioners and scholars from across India.
