Working with colleagues this appointment is an opportunity to contribute to the next stage of planning education at Westminster, responding to the diversity of London, international contexts and the challenges of climate change. The post-holder will contribute to the School's research and knowledge exchange, joining one of the School's five research themes / groups.
