Sustainable tourism practices the topic of new book from WIT Press

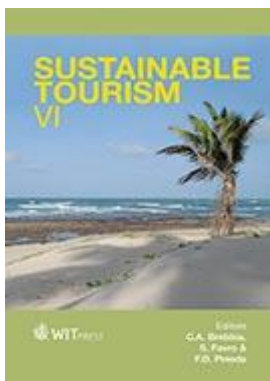
We would like to bring to your attention a new book that may be of interest to readers of *RNIU*, especially since it includes Mexican research:

Sustainable Tourism VI contains 26 papers presented at the 6th International Conference on Sustainable Tourism, organized in Opatija, Croatia, by the Wessex Institute of Technology, with the collaboration of the Complutense University of Madrid. The meeting was first held in 2004. After ten successful years, the Sustainable Tourism Conference is now well established and attracts papers on a wide variety of topics.

Tourism, research and development encompass many different fields of knowledge. The papers presented at The Sustainable Tourism conferences cover diverse components of tourism phenomena, ranging from biophysics, to socio economic and cultural aspects, as well as field studies and academic research, stressing as well the entrepreneurial and institutional side of the industry. During the last decade, the meeting has evolved, reflecting the changes in the field so that the Conference now tries to address, among other aspects, the need to develop dynamic models that can analyze existing data to predict future trends.

The common denominator of all tourism modes is the growing availability of leisure time. This is a consequence of the changes that have taken place in the pattern of our society in the last hundred years or so. In 1900 the life expectancy of the world's population was only 35 years in developed countries; now the world population in general has more free time and at the same time traveling has become easier.

This book analyzes those as well as other issues presenting new research ideas in the field of tourism, with contributions from different specialists focusing on the visitors and their leisure time.
