

The upcoming Getty exhibition <u>Cave Temples of Dunhuang</u>: <u>Buddhist Art on China's Silk Road</u> was formally announced at a July 15 Getty Center event. Organized by the Getty Conservation Institute, the Getty Research Institute, the Dunhuang Academy, and the Dunhuang Foundation, the exhibition will celebrate the over 25 years of collaboration between the GCI and the Dunhuang Academy to <u>conserve and protect the Mogao</u> <u>Grottoes</u>, a World Heritage site.




ICCM Conference Proceedings
