



The Diamond Sutra: A Story of Printing, Piety, and Preservation on the Silk Road

Susan Whitfield, the director of the International Dunhuang Project, took the audience on a journey of exploration of the many facets of the Diamond Sutra (a sacred Mahayana Buddhist text), which dates from 868 and is the world's oldest dated complete printed book. Found in Cave 17, also known as the Library Cave, it was one of a cache of over 40,000 objects that were sealed up for a millennium before their rediscovery in 1900s.
