SeaCities: Exploring the interface between sea and cities – PhD Candidates sought – scholarship opportunity

Griffith University's Cities Research Institute (CRI) and Griffith Sciences are offering three full-time scholarships for new PhD candidates interested in researching topics relating to the problems and opportunities experienced in the interface between sea and cities. Topics can be as varied as the impacts of anthropogenic climate change, opportunities for aquatic food production and changing approaches to maritime transport.

In the context of cruise tourism, my colleague, A/Prof Gui Lohmann and I would like to recruit a PhD candidate interested in researching some aspect of the city and sea interface relating to cruise infrastructure development. This could include, for example, multi-use cruise infrastructure development; utilising cruise infrastructure as a link between city and sea; new design approaches to cruise infrastructure to take into consideration climate change; the impact of potential changes in cruise ship design and operations on cruise infrastructure, etc.

CRI's research in this area is being undertaken in partnership with the City of Gold Coast (Queensland). Successful candidates will receive a tax-exempt living allowance of AUD 27,082 per year for three years, and will be available to candidates enrolling full-time at Griffith's Gold Coast campus. (Note that domestic Australian students are not liable for tuition fees.)
