Assistant Professor (tenure track) or Professor of Teaching (non-tenure-track)

### **Position Summary:**

Social and Cultural Factors in Landscape Architecture with a focus on the political, cultural, historical, and social influences on design. Landscape architects are increasingly concerned about the role design plays in creating, maintaining, or challenging social and environmental injustices. The person in this position will critically engage these debates from the perspective of place-based design and design activism. Candidates will be expected to engage in scholarly research in their area(s) of specialization. Primary teaching will be in the candidate's area of expertise and will include at least one design studio.

### **Principle Duties:**

Successful candidates must demonstrate the broad skills necessary for teaching in a professional landscape architecture program. The expectation is that the candidate will teach three-four courses over the academic year (six if Teaching Professional), including at least one design studio and at least one community-based learning course. The candidate will contribute to the Landscape and Urban Studies (LUS) undergraduate degree program as well as to the professional MS Urban and Regional Planning program. Mentoring undergraduate students and advising graduate students is expected.
