

Lecturer Position in Recreation and Leisure Studies Department of Recreation and Leisure Studies University of Waterloo

The Department of Recreation and Leisure Studies in the Faculty of Applied Health Sciences at the University of Waterloo invites applications from exceptional teachers for a Definite Term Lecturer position (2-Year term with possibility of reappointment) in recreation and leisure studies, broadly defined, beginning April 1, 2020 (negotiable).

The successful candidate must have a minimum MA Degree and demonstrated teaching excellence in recreation and leisure studies, sport management, therapeutic recreation, tourism, event management, or a related discipline. Consistent with the University, Faculty and Department strategic plans, applicants must be able to foster and enhance the integration of critical thinking skills, work-integrated learning approaches, problem-solving skills, and various forms of communication (presentations, written work, debates, etc.) into classroom pedagogy. The ability to develop and teach an array of traditional and online courses is an asset. Duties include teaching six undergraduate and/or graduate courses per year, with some potential new course development or course revision development, and possible contributions to undergraduate honours thesis supervision and graduate committees. Salary range of \$65,000 to \$80,000 based on qualifications will be considered.

The closing date for applications is February 14, 2020. Three letters of reference will be requested for applicants invited for an interview.
