# International Course on the Conservation of Earthen Architecture

Local and international experts gathered in Al Ain, United Arab Emirates and Nizwa, Oman from October 22 to November 19 for this onemonth training course presented in partnership with the Department of Culture and Tourism—Abu Dhabi.

Al Ain served as an open-air laboratory for participants to learn practical, hands-on methods for preserving earthen buildings and archaeological sites. A weeklong study trip to Oman provided participants with an exercise on the conservation of urban settlements made of earth in Nizwa's al Aqr neighborhood, an ancient, fortified city built with earthen bricks.






