LSGS is particularly interested in scholars who move beyond traditional studies of communities bounded by a singular national origin.

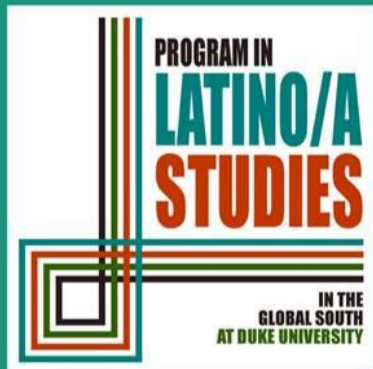
