
Terra 2022 World Congress on Earthen Architectural Heritage

Getty Post-Baccalaureate Conservation Internships

The internships are the first nationwide effort to provide support and hands-on conservation experience to post-baccalaureate young professionals from diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds preparing to apply to conservation graduate programs. The internships are offered in the conservation studios and labs at the Getty Center in Los Angeles and the Getty Villa Museum, along with Los Angeles museums, including the Academy Museum of Motion Pictures; the Huntington Library, Art Museum, and Botanical Gardens; the Fowler Museum at UCLA; the Los Angeles County Museum of Art; and the Autry Museum of the American West.
