Members: 3 to 5 speakers, from at least 2 Latin

American countries, and from at least 2 different fields (academia, social organizations, public officials, producers)

Format: maximum length 500 words
Language:
Portuguese, Spanish and English
Spacing: single line spacing
Font: Arial 11 pt

Contents: Titles; Authors, 5 key words; Thematic axis, Introduction,

methodology and

objectives,

results.
