Lee Kuan Yew World City Prize Special Lecture: Medellín – A City in Transformation



This special lecture will outline Medellín's development over the past three decades, a time of considerable social and economic difficulties for the city and its population. It will highlight how social and spatial plans, within a context of strong participatory, associative and democratic work, helped the city to overcome these difficulties and start looking ahead to a brighter future. The lecture will stress the relevance of multi-scale planning, urbanism, public architecture and state-provided infrastructure as powerful social development tools.


