Postdoctoral Associate position (Research)

About the position

I invite applications from scholars with a PhD in geography, urban studies, sociology, or a related field, with interested and background in critical (urban) food studies. The postdoctoral associate (PDA) will engage in research full time and demonstrate a high degree of self-direction. Specifically, I expect the PDA to:

(A) EITHER (option 1) conduct research in support of my current SSHRC funded research project on *the intersection of food and housing insecurity in Calgary* (further information provided upon request),

OR (option 2) conduct an *independent yet complementary research project related to your own expertise* and my research fields, i.e. in relation to one of the following three research themes: a) Alternative food networks and alternative economies, b) Urban and urban-rural food movements, c) Relation between food and housing insecurity; and

(B) contribute generally to ongoing research activities at my team (e.g. collaborate on publications, funding applications or conference presentations), regular team meetings, and to mentoring my graduate students.

The PDA will have the opportunity to join and extend existing research capacities of a dynamic cluster of faculty and graduate students undertaking crucial urban studies and food research, for example, as part of the UCCities – Global Urban Research Group at the UofC, the Calgary Institute for the Humanities working groups, and the O'Brien Institute for Public Health. We will provide mentoring and professional development opportunities, and there will also be the option to contribute to teaching in the Department of Geography. In order to actively engage in and contribute to those activities, I expect the PDA to reside in Calgary.

Qualifications:

- PhD in geography, urban studies, sociology, or a related field
- Outstanding record of academic performance
- Excellent verbal communication and academic writing skills (English), well-developed organizational skills, critical thinking
- Strong interest and research experience in one or more of the following fields: critical urban studies, critical food studies, urban food movements, urban social movements, community food security, food justice, food sovereignty, alternative food movements, urban inequality, housing



- Enthusiasm for research, including: experience in publishing (peer-reviewed publications are an asset), keen interest in presenting at academic conferences, participating in project-related workshops and meetings, maintaining a high degree of research productivity
- Expertise in empirical (qualitative) social science research methods
- An ability to work independently, as well as collaboratively, and to multi-task
- Previous research experience in Canada is an asset

Further information on the position

Start date: Fall 2019 or earlier. If applying from outside Canada, please allow at least 3 month for obtaining visa/ work permits and other documentation.

Duration and funding: This position is funded for one year only, however, extension through further funding acquired by the PDA will be strongly supported. Additional funding applications, including joint applications, are highly encouraged. Ideally, the candidate will already be familiar with the Canadian funding landscape.

Salary and benefits: The PDA will receive a semi-monthly salary, that is subject to deductions for statutory benefits such as Canadian Pension Plan (CPP), Employment Insurance (EI) and income tax. All postdoctoral scholars whose initial appointment is for 12 months or longer will be eligible to receive the Alberta Health Care Insurance Plan (AHCIP). The AHCIP provides Alberta residents with coverage for hospital and physician services. Additionally, PDAs whose initial appointments are six months or longer will be automatically enrolled in Alberta Blue Cross Plan C extended health and dental benefits. On top of the salary, I offer a limited research allowance to support research related activities.

About the University and the City of Calgary:

The *University of Calgary* is a leading comprehensive research university, with over 30,000 students, including over 5,000 graduate students. The university is currently ranked 7 out of the 32 Canadian Universities, and is making tremendous progress on its Eyes High journey to be recognized as one of Canada's top five research universities.
