The Department of Recreation, Park and Tourism Management at Penn State University invites applicants for a graduate assistantship position, which will begin in Fall 2019. We offer a competitive nine-month stipend, tuition waiver, and health insurance subsidy. Graduate assistants are required to work approximately 20 hours per week.

We are seeking an exceptional student with interest in undertaking interdisciplinary research on *the role of communication and social media in tourism crisis management*. The successful applicant will work under the supervision of Dr. Ashley Schroeder (<u>faculty bio</u>) on several projects related to this research agenda. This assistantship is for students with an interest in developing research-based solutions to help the tourism industry better prepare for, respond to, and recover from crises. In addition, this assistantship is for students with research interests that align with these research goals.
