

POST-DOCTORAL FELLOW POSITION ON TOURISM AND HOSPITALITY MANAGEMENT

The U.S.-Asia Center for Tourism & Hospitality Research in the School of Sport, Tourism and Hospitality Management at Temple University invites applications for one post-doctoral fellow position on tourism and hospitality management. Temple University's U.S.-Asia Center for Tourism & Hospitality Research was recently established to be a leading brain trust that advances the development of the US and Asian tourism and hospitality industries, education, and research. It aims to establish and enhance connections between government, industry, and other public entities in the tourism and hospitality areas. Members of the Center are STHM faculty with national and international recognition, and come from broad disciplinary and industry backgrounds. We are seeking candidates that have a record of scholarship who have the potential to work in an interdisciplinary team to publish in premier journals. Position: Postdoctoral Fellow (Non-Tenure Track); Full Time; 12 months; One year appointment, with possibility of renewal

Location: Philadelphia PA, USA

Application Timeline: Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is

filled.

Start Date: Negotiable with mid-August preferred

Compensation: Salary is very competitive and commensurate with experience

Qualifications:

Candidates may come from different backgrounds, such as management, marketing, economics, geography, sociology, or a related field. Candidates should possess a minimum of a Ph.D. and have training or equivalent research skill, subject knowledge, and expertise and experience with a record of publication in peer-reviewed scientific journals. Preference will be given to candidates with (1) strong communication skills in team work; (2) excellent quantitative analytics skills; and (3) past project experiences on research grants.

Duties:

Perform research required by the Center director to a high standard, work with both academics and industry partners to initiate and engage in various research projects, and play an active role in ongoing projects within the Center. The post-doctoral fellow is expected to collaborate with faculty at the Center, but can also pursue his/her own independent research agenda.

Application Information:

The selection process will begin immediately upon receipt of applications. An application should include: a) cover letter, b) statement of proposed research, c) CV, and d) contact details of at least two references. Conditions:

The postdoctoral fellow must provide a transcript and/or diploma certifying that he/she has received his/her degrees. Candidates who have completed all of their requirements for the advanced degrees, but have not yet received their degrees, should provide documentation certifying that all requirements for the degree have been completed.
