The Latin American Network of Environmental Conflicts (COLCA Network: redcolca.org) is a space for interdisciplinary and intersectoral debate. Throughout its previous editions it has brought together the scientific community, political actors, indigenous peoples, environmental leaders and other segments of civil society. The objective of the network is to discuss in depth the problems that trigger environmental conflicts in Latin America in the world, as well as the opportunities that are generated for the sustainable management of these territories.

The V Latin American Congress on Environmental Conflicts (CoLCA) will address an array of thematic axes on environmental conflicts from political ecology, ecological economics and social economics under the heading "Climate Justice, Socioecological Transitions and Social Movements". CoLCA will be held in Brazil for the first time and will take place in the city of Manaus, capital of the state of Amazonas, Pan-Amazon region of Latin America. Its planned format, as in all previous editions, will be in person. As is the tradition at CoLCA, the event will include a pre-course in Political Ecology, Ecological Economy and Social Economy, Conferences, Workshops, Symposiums, Field Trips, and other activities aimed at strengthening academic work and dialogue with the communities involved in Environmental Conflicts in Latin America and elsewhere.



In the two days prior to the congress, professionals and academics will address the central issues related to environmental conflicts at the local, regional and global levels.
