The Opportunity

Monash Urban Laboratory within the Faculty of Art Design and Architecture (MADA) at Monash University invites applications for a fully funded, 3-year PhD scholarship for commencement in Semester 1, 2019. The scholarship provides a stipend of \$27,082 per annum tax exempt for three years along with additional travel support.

Monash Urban Laboratory brings together a large collective of researchers and practitioners to engage in integrated, interdisciplinary and transformational research on urban architecture, urban design and urban planning in Melbourne and beyond.

We seek applications from international candidates with a background in architecture, landscape architecture or urban environment studies. The successful PhD applicant will work under the supervision of Professor Nigel Bertram and Dr Tom Morgan as part of a larger collaborative project: Atlas of the Underground: the deep urban history of Melbourne. This project proposes to use the tangible urban environment of Melbourne as a case study to understand how diverse and currently separated fields of research (such as historic geography, scientific and industry based information relating to fields such as geology and hydrology, human and indigenous geography), come together to affect the way cities develop and change.

The research will include:

- detailed study of selected existing physical environments within the greater Melbourne region and the way they have transitioned over time. This will include on-site fieldwork, and review of archival material from a wide range of sources
- detailed documentation and analysis of local and recurring urban natural and constructed environment typologies at different scales, and exploration of their opportunities and constraints
- production of detailed, graphically clear and accessible maps and three-dimensional drawings to form the Atlas itself

Research will be undertaken both individually and as part of a collaborative research team working on related topics

Candidate Requirements

This scholarship opportunity is open to international candidates only.

The successful applicant will have an excellent academic and practice track record with a background in architectural, landscape and/or urban studies. Skills or experience in GIS modelling and data integration from fields such as hydrology or geology would be highly desirable. Experience or interest in international, comparative work is ideal.

Applicants will be considered provided that they meet Monash entry requirements for PhD admission, which include English-language skills. Scholarship holders must be enrolled full-time and on campus.
