The Department of City and Regional Planning (DCRP) at the University of California, Berkeley, seeks applications for a faculty position in Urban Infrastructure Planning in the Global Context at the rank of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, or Professor with an expected start date of July 1, 2017. The successful candidate must have the vision and drive to chart new intellectual territory, be committed to developing new initiatives and multidisciplinary collaborations, attract externally-funded research, and demonstrate a strong commitment to teaching excellence.

We seek applicants who study critical challenges in urban infrastructure: a set of capital investments, physical flows, and sociotechnical institutions linking urban residents with engineered and planned services such as energy, water, wastewater/sewer, solid waste, information and communication technologies, transportation, parks, and green infrastructure. We are particularly interested in scholars who take a comparative and global perspective.

The candidate's research and teaching should ideally emphasize multisector infrastructure planning, and should take account of the complex and interconnected nature of global, regional and local infrastructure systems as they impact other urban planning concerns such the built environment, public health, resilience, sustainability and economic development. Relevant research areas include the relationship of urban infrastructure to equity and social justice; ecological economics; environmental management (e.g., green infrastructure); urban design; ecosystem services; slum upgrading; emerging technologies; and climate change mitigation, adaptation and resilience. We are also interested in candidates who study the history of systems of urban infrastructure and their recent transformation; demand management of urban infrastructure; public and private approaches to infrastructure provision; and innovative financing.
