Postdoctoral Fellow in Urban Studies The Center for Urban and Global Studies (CUGS) at Trinity College in Connecticut invites applications for the Jeff Kelter Postdoctoral Fellowship, beginning in Fall 2020. Supported by endowed funds, this position seeks outstanding recent PhDs to teach and research at a nationally ranked liberal arts college in a city. The candidate should have completed the PhD by August 2020 or have received a PhD no earlier than 2015, in urban studies, urban planning, urban design, geography, sociology, anthropology, public policy, or another urban studies related discipline. The postdoctoral fellow will teach one undergraduate course during each of Trinity’s two semesters, with a priority on cities of North America but from a global-comparative perspective. Courses on urban planning, housing, land use, real estate, and/or spatial analysis using GIS are welcome. These courses would be integral to the growing Urban Studies program/major and the Cities Program for first-year students, and can be cross-listed with the department or program of the fellow’s discipline. In addition, the fellow is expected to carry out their research while participating in and assisting CUGS’ research projects and activities. The position carries a competitive salary and benefits with a small research fund, and can be renewed for a second year.

Application Materials All applications must include the following and be due to <https://trincoll.peopleadmin.com/> by January 1, 2020. • A detailed application letter describing the teaching expertise as stated above, and research interests • A current curriculum vitae • A writing sample, preferably a published or forthcoming journal article, or a crucial chapter of the dissertation • Two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from the primary dissertation adviser • Sample syllabi for two or three undergraduate courses that are focused in the areas specified above.
