We welcome applications from doctoral candidates wishing to focus their studies within the themes of: Tourism Management, Tourism and Hotel Human Capital, Tourism and Hospitality Sustainability (in particular with relations to the UNSDG), and Tourism and Hospitality Productivity, Quality and Marketing.

A [Lincoln University Doctor of Philosophy \(PhD\)](#) qualification will give you the opportunity to not only challenge yourself to new levels of thinking and problem solving, it will give you the knowledge and skills to create new tourism and hospitality knowledge that will ultimately benefit business and society. Our goal is to provide you with a PhD programme that will have you working alongside professional individuals and organisations, and industry, throughout New Zealand and the world. Lincoln University has offered tourism degrees since 1984 and hotel management degrees since 1995 and is recognized for leadership in tourism sustainability and hospitality management and research.

Fees and Funding

While PhD candidates yearly fees are \$8,226.00 per annum ([fee-link data](#)), scholarships are available as follows:

Lincoln University [Doctoral Scholarship](#): \$28,000.00 stipend for up to three years. Applications close 01 October each year.

Research funding of up to \$6,000.00 (from the Faculty) for the duration of the candidates study for matters such as conference attendance, etc.

Annual Faculty Summer Scholarships: Up to \$5,000.00 tax-free, and Faculty Graduate Scholarships of up to \$8,000.00, tax free, to work part-time alongside senior Faculty researchers on existing projects.

If you decide to apply, please make sure your topic aligns with one or more of the themes highlighted above. Your entire application will be reviewed by a committee before making an admissions decision. The ideal candidate will have demonstrated:

- academic proficiency in tourism and/or hospitality,
- have a topic that aligns with one or more of the above themes research areas, and
