

Assistant Professor of Community & Regional Planning

Summary of Duties and Responsibilities: The Department of Community and Regional Planning (CRP) in the College of Design at Iowa State University is seeking to fill a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor starting August 16th, 2022.

The successful candidate will contribute to the missions of the department and College by teaching core planning courses and electives at the graduate and undergraduate levels. We are seeking a candidate who has displayed research and teaching expertise in the broadly defined area of **environmental planning**. We encourage applicants with specific research and teaching interests that include (but are not limited to) environmental sustainability, disaster planning, environmental policy, climate change, and sustainable and resilient communities. We expect the successful candidate to strengthen connections between CRP, sustainable agriculture and/or transportation programs. We expect the successful candidate will be able to develop and teach a variety of courses in their areas of expertise, including those with large enrollments.

Required Minimum Qualifications: A completed PhD in urban planning, geography, public policy, or a related field by the start of employment.

Preferred Qualifications: 1) Documented teaching experience; 2) Evidence/promise of a strong publication record; 3) Evidence/potential for externally-funded research; 4) Subject-area expertise in environmental sustainability, disaster planning, environmental policy, climate change, sustainable and resilient communities and/or a related field.

Department/Program & College Description: The [CRP department](http://www.design.iastate.edu/CRP) integrates research, teaching, and outreach consistent with Iowa State's land grant mission. We emphasize community-based learning and scholarship and maintain a close relationship with the University's Extension and Outreach program.
