## Why pursue an MA in Latin American Studies at Stanford?

- Immerse yourself in contemporary scholarly debates of the region through seminars, teaching, and mentorship by outstanding Stanford faculty and visiting professors.
- Learn Spanish as well as less commonly taught languages, including Portuguese, Nahuatl, and Quechua
- Develop research skills in advanced social science methods, design thinking, visualization, Geographic Information Systems, and the digital humanities.
- Join a lively community and a small cohort of students with a passion for the region.

This interdisciplinary, one-year graduate degree consists of a core set of courses that survey the history, politics, culture, society, environment, and ecology of the region, along with advanced language training. The program also offers a certificate in human rights in the Americas. Graduates typically go on to pursue careers in higher education, business, government, and NGOs.

## **Joint Degree Programs**

To be eligible for a dual degree program (MBA, JD, or MD), candidates must apply and be accepted independently to both programs.
