A Course for Mid-Career Professionals Blended Format: Online and In Person May to August 2023

This course aims to advance the conservation of modern heritage and architecture by providing participants with methodological and practical tools. Through lectures, discussions, exercises, demonstrations, site visits, and field exercises participants will learn about advances in research and practice that have influenced approaches to modern heritage conservation. The course will also serve as a platform to share experiences, challenges, and thoughts among participants and instructors.


Twentieth-Century Historic Thematic Framework Seminars Offered

The Conserving Modern Architecture Initiative is partnering with European members of the ICOMOS International Scientific Committee on Twentieth Century Heritage to develop a series of seminars to introduce the *Twentieth-Century Historic Thematic Framework: A Tool for Assessing Heritage Places* publication, explaining how it can be used and why it is beneficial in broadening our ideas about modern heritage.

Each European seminar is led by a different regional group and will explore the individual themes or subthemes found in the framework. The first seminar, held on September 22, 2022, looked at the theme of Internationalization, New Nation States, and Human Rights. The second seminar to be held on October 14, 2022, will be an introduction to the framework, looking at all ten themes. Three more seminars are planned for winter 2022–23 and summer 2023, which will explore the themes of Health, Global Corporations, and War and its Aftermath.








<u>Cultural Heritage and Mass Atrocities</u>
