Graduate Assistantship with Recreation, Sport and Tourism

The Department of Recreation, Sport, and Tourism at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign invites applications for a doctoral research assistantship beginning in Fall 2020. The successful candidate will work closely with Dr. Sharon Suiwen Zou and is expected to conduct high-quality research in the area of tourism marketing and tourist behavior. Students from any social science disciplines interested in tourism and leisure are encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to applicants with research interests at the intersections between marketing principles (e.g., consumer behavior, pricing) and individual/community well-being in the context of tourism and leisure.

The qualified candidate will be offered a nine-month 50%-time (i.e., 20 hours per week) research assistantship for the first two years of study, which includes a competitive monthly stipend, a tuition waiver, and health insurance benefits are available. Opportunity to renew the assistantship is available, which is contingent on the student's satisfactory performance and availability of funding.

- Strong quantitative analysis skills (e.g., text mining, multivariate statistics)
- Work experience in the field of tourism and/or hospitality
