However, we welcome applications in any sphere of urban studies and from anywhere in the world, provided the proposed research aligns with the work of a potential mentor in CURA. Before submitting an EOI, please carefully study the documents at https://urbanstudiesfoundation.org/funding/postdoctoral-research-fellowships/, especially *Further Particulars* and *Frequently Asked Questions*. The EoI should include three elements:

- A CV with details of achievements in urban studies, including publications, grant awards and prizes.
- An outline proposal of up to 1,000 words setting out the proposed research programme. This should include research questions and goals, explaining how the project goes beyond the 'state of the art' in the field and what makes it innovative (e.g. conceptually, methodologically, empirically) and anticipated contributions to the field of urban studies (including non-academic beneficiaries where appropriate).
- A covering letter of no more than 2 pages demonstrating eligibility, highlighting synergies with CURA and identifying a potential mentor or mentors, and explaining what makes you an outstanding candidate for this Fellowship with reference to USF criteria.

Applications will be reviewed by a panel of CURA members. Successful candidate(s) at EoI stage will be notified by Friday 30th September. They will work with a CURA mentor to develop the full application for submission to USF by **1st November 2021**. We will provide brief feedback to unsuccessful candidates.
