About the Department:

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism Management (PRTM) is a multi-disciplinary department focused on critical research questions related to human dimensions of natural and built environments, community health and well-being, and equitable and sustainable tourism. The mission of the Department is to advance and disseminate scholarship concerning the management and use of natural and cultural resources for recreation, tourism, and sport through research, teaching, and public engagement. Inclusiveness and diversity are academic imperatives and thus are university and departmental goals. PRTM faculty enjoy a vibrant scholarly environment supportive of innovative high-impact research, teaching, and community engagement.

Essential Job Duties:

- The Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism Management is accepting applications for a non-tenure track nine-month, full-time appointment with responsibilities for teaching and mentoring of undergraduate students (80%), discovery of knowledge through discipline-guided inquiry (10%), and service within professional societies and the university (10%).
- Successful candidates will teach 3 undergraduate courses per semester in the curriculum in parks, recreation, and tourism management; advise and mentor undergraduate students; contribute service to support the department, college, or university as assigned; and conduct scholarship on the practice of teaching and learning in academia.
- The anticipated start date for the position is August 22, 2022.

Qualifications:

Minimum Education and Experience:

- Doctorate at the time of appointment from a disciplinary background in parks, recreation and tourism management or a closely related field.
- Record of teaching undergraduate students in the field of parks, recreation and management.

Other Required Qualifications and Experience:

- Evidence of a strong commitment to high-quality and innovative instruction focused on active and collaborative learning.
- Candidates must demonstrate a commitment to fostering diversity, equity, inclusion, and justice.
- Candidates must exhibit strong oral and written communication skills and a willingness to work collaboratively with faculty and staff colleagues.
- Candidates must demonstrate potential to advance the scholarship of teaching and learning.
- Candidates must be committed to continuous improvement of the department's curriculum.

Preferred Qualifications and Experience:

- Experience engaging students with community partnerships and implementing service learning projects.
- Experience with the use of instructional technology.
- Candidates with demonstrated industry experience and/or teaching experience in recreation programming and/or park, recreation and event facilities management are highly desirable.
- Candidates with demonstrated undergraduate advising experience are highly desirable.
- Candidates with a record of scholarship in teaching and learning are highly desirable.
