The position is located in Phoenix, Arizona.

As a tenured research faculty, the director maintains a strategic production of cross-disciplinary collaborative research and scholarship.

The successful candidate will be expected to teach and mentor graduate and undergrad students. Excellent in-class or online instruction delivery is expected. Course assignments will be determined in conjunction with the school director and the dean. The faculty member will also participate in service activities for the school, college, university and community. The appointment will begin July 1, 2022 with a one-week orientation at ASU in mid-August 2022.
