

Scope of the seminar

Understanding accessibility to urban employment is a gateway to examining broader issues of urban inequalities across urban regions. Accessibility to various jobs reveals a spectrum of urban issues, such as unequal education, discrimination, segmented labor markets, gender-based job divisions, spatial imbalances, and transport-related social exclusion that translate into income gaps, housing disparities, and barriers to social mobility.

Two influential intellectual efforts in the social sciences have contributed to the development of the literature around accessibility to jobs: the *mobility turn* and the *accessibility shift*. Both approaches have important implications for urban planning and policy. The mobility turn has prioritized approaches based on mobility and transport-related policies. The accessibility shift has called to complement mobility and transport-related policies with the spatial distribution of opportunities and urban resources.

Within this context, the Latin American Chapter of the International Network for Transport and Accessibility in Low-Income Communities ([INTALInC-LAC](#)) is organizing its VI International Seminar of Contemporary Mobilities on the topic of accessibility to urban employment. The seminar brings together leading scholars at the forefront of discussion around accessibility to jobs in Latin America and beyond.
