Applications are invited for an outstanding postdoctoral scholar to join the Carolina Transportation Program working under the direction of Prof. Noreen McDonald in the Department of City and Regional Planning at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. The postdoctoral scholar will conduct research on road safety and transportation planning and policy. Current funded research areas include 1) pedestrian safety and autonomous vehicles, 2) para-transit and technology-enabled shared mobility, and 3) analysis of practice response to changing mobility patterns and tools. The postdoctoral scholar will be expected to significantly contribute across several projects through research design, data collection, data analysis, manuscript development, and manage project staff including doctoral, master's, and undergraduate students. Several opportunities to be involved in peer-reviewed journal publications are anticipated.

Selected candidates will have the opportunity to engage with intellectual opportunities across UNC but particularly in the Department of City & Regional Planning and Highway Safety Research Center.

The candidate must hold a PhD in city and regional planning, civil engineering, public policy, or related discipline. Experience conducting research on transportation planning or policy issues is essential. Successful candidates will also demonstrate strong training in quantitative analytical and statistical approaches along with knowledge of research design.
